Seidel for Senate: Donna Seidel Announces Candidacy for Senate District 29

Wausau – Assembly Assistant Minority Leader Donna Seidel announced today that she is running for State Senate against Pam Galloway for the upcoming recall election. At an event in Wausau, Seidel pledged to run an ambitious campaign aimed at changing the focus of government from special interests back to the individuals whom elect our officials.

“The will of the people shall be the law of the land.” Seidel said in her announcement speech quoting a mural in the Governor’s Conference Room. “The leaders who are in charge in Madison have lost sight of the fact that they are accountable to the people who elected them, and that is why we are seeing such public outcry and passion.”

In the coming months, Seidel plans to travel through the entire 29th Senate District to personally meet with Wisconsin families. During her visits, Seidel will ask their input and discuss her plans to make the 29th Senate District an even better place to live, work and raise our families.

“Over the last year a lot has changed in Wisconsin and I hear from people everyday who don’t like the direction we’re going. We need to bring our priorities back in line with Wisconsin values to make sure that our kids receive a quality education, we have access to affordable health care and that we have a well trained workforce to help grow our economy.”

Seidel was first elected to the Assembly in 2004. Prior to serving the Legislature, Seidel was elected to be the Marathon County Clerk of Circuit Courts eight consecutive times, serving for 16 years. Seidel has committed her career to serving the people of Marathon County first as a police officer with the Wausau Police Department and later as an investigator with the District Attorney’s office, supporting victims of assault and child abuse. She continues to make the same issues she has always been passionate about among her top legislative priorities.
